

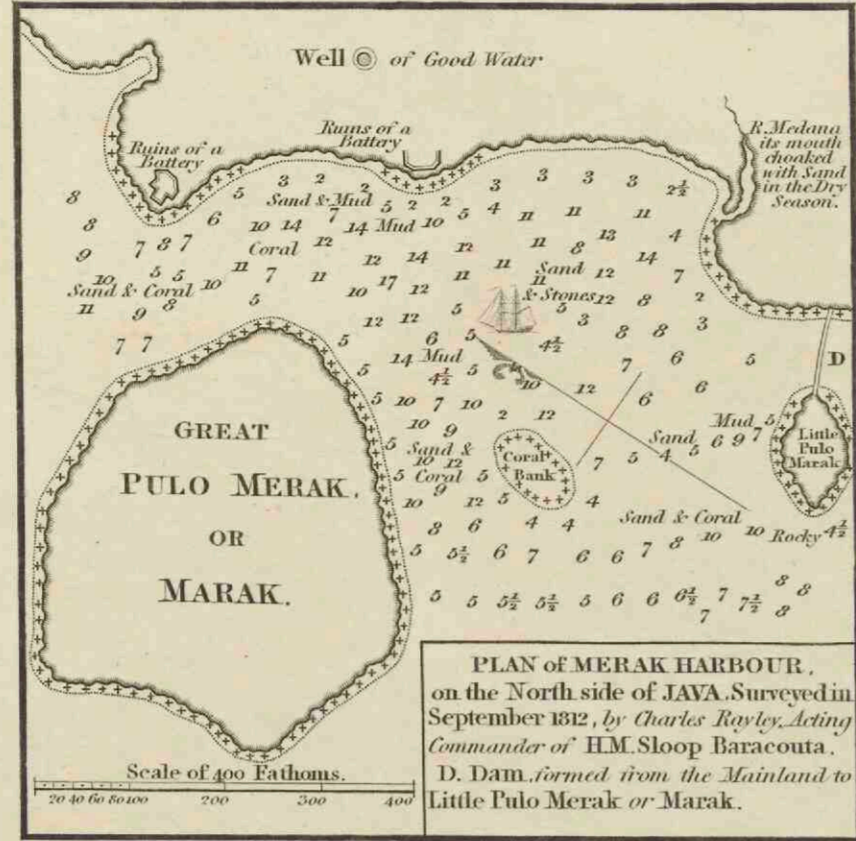
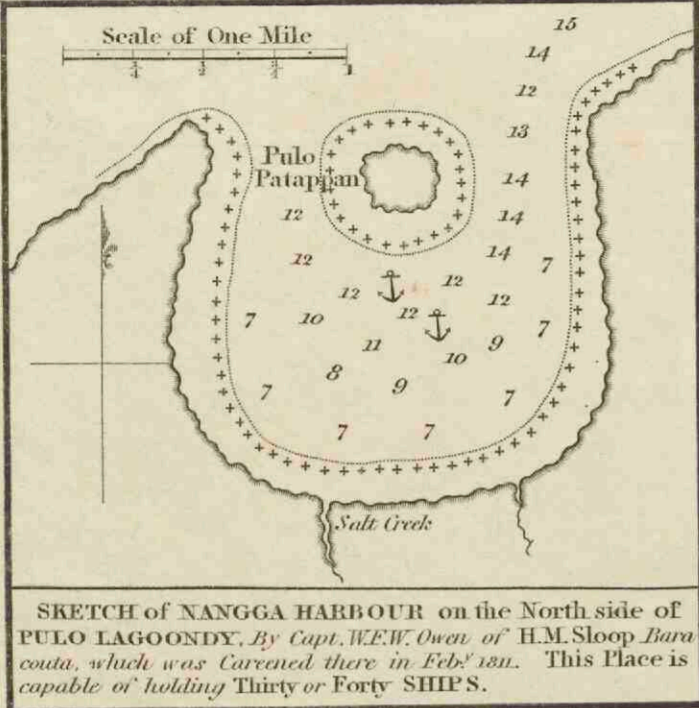

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EXPLANATORY REMARKS.

THE BASIS OF THIS CHART, are, Chromometric Admeasurements from BATAVIA to JAPA HEAD, by Captain Leach Wilson and Mearns, corresponding to one Mile, and corroborated by Captain Wilson's connected Chain of Triangles between these Places, extending also to NORTH ISLAND, to CROCATOA, and the CIRCUMJACENT ISLANDS; together with Observations for the Latitude, taken carefully in several Places. The Principal POINTS and PEAKS in the Narrow part of the Strait, have been laid down from Transit Bearings of each other, and that Part will probably be found almost equal in Accuracy to a regular Survey. THESE VALUABLE MATERIALS, were supplied by CAPT. Wilson of the Royal Navy, Capt. T. Lyne, Capt. T. Wards Journal, and by Capt. Krusenstern, who Published at S. Petersburg in 1825, an excellent Memoir and Chart of the STRAIT OF SUNDA. THE VARIATION of the NEEDLE, is very small at present in the space contained within This Chart; Observations taken lately at BATAVIA, gave a five Minutes Easterly Variation, and afterwards a few Minutes Westerly; but it is thought to be about Half a Degree Easterly in the STRAIT, and probably also at BATAVIA.

STROOM ROCK bears from the Highest Part of THWART THE WAY N.W. 1/2 N. which may be used to know in the Night. The ZUPHEN ISLANDS should not be rounded too close, for in Feb. 1825, the Bonbay was nearly lost by a Current running 1/2 mile to the Westward which swept Sakampang off her upon the Reef about Two cables lengths from Boats Island.
