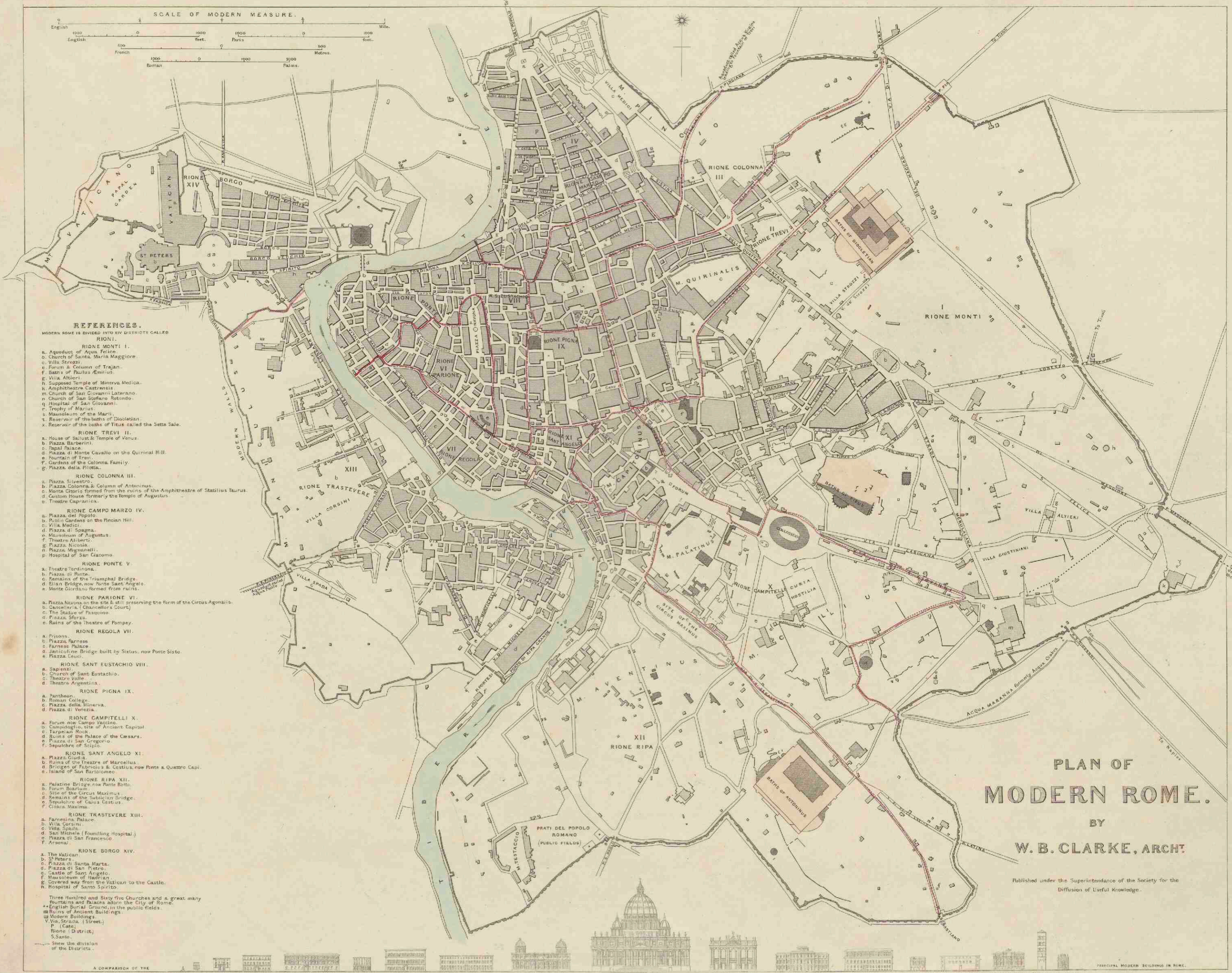
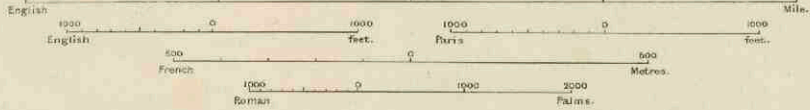




Plan of modern Rome
