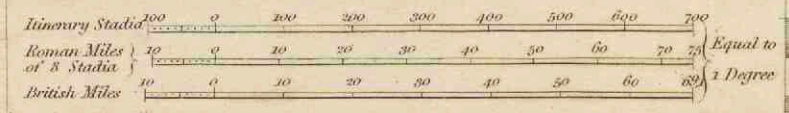

Complaints have been made that the Maps are sometimes injured by folding, before they reach purchasers in remote parts of the Country. This evil ought not to occur when the bookseller's parcel is sufficiently large to allow of their being inclosed without folding them closely: when that is not the case, it is recommended to use rollers, though a small expense will be incurred.
