


Observations on which this Map is grounded.
 Boston 42° 25' Longitude from Paris 71° 0' 25" Double 1700
 New York 40° 45' 74° 4' 20" Double 17

Konelikut is taken chiefly from the Survey of Gardner and Kellock, made in 1737.
 The Massachusetts and Rhode Island Divisions, from particular Surveys, Plans and Charts.
 New Hampshire from the Survey of Mitchell and Bazem in 1750, especially this last.
 The Coast from Cape Elizabeth Eastward and the River Kennebec from the Survey made by order of Governor Shirley in 1754.
 Long Island, New York Harbor, and Coast at Hudson's River, to Lydius or Nicholson's Fort, are laid down from very large and particular Surveys with that of Bazem and others.
 Wood Creek with its Sacrament and part of Chauplain Lake, from a French Survey.
 The Lands granted by Massachusetts Bay Province but are since determined to be within the Province of New Hampshire are distinguished by Purple.
